Charles E. Crockett

Served as a Corporal during World War One, he was assigned to Company A, 102nd Machine Gun Battalion 26th Infantry Division, American Expeditionary Forces. Corporal Crocket was wounded at the 2nd Battle of the Marne, for which he was awarded the Purple Heart Medal. He enlisted on May 21, 1917 and discharged on April 29, 1919.

On September 2, 1927 he married Alyce A. Guy, they lived Lynn, Massachusetts.

The letter was written by Corporal Charles Everett Crockett, while serving in World War One and assigned to Co A. 102 Machine Gun Battalion, 26 Infantry Division, American Expeditionary Forces. 
Transcription of the letter.....

Dec 31, 1917 "Somewhere in France" Dear Hattie: Happy New Year! How is every thing in Lynn? We have about six inches of snow here but it isn't very cold. Have you been up to the Welfare Association lately? I wouldn't put to much time in up there as I don't think its what it is marked up to be. As yet all we have received is a paper with pictures of France in it from them. If you have any thing to send or give sent it to me and I'll give whatever you send to some of my friends. I wouldn't be a bit surprised if the officers got the most benefit from the Association in other words they'll get the cream and we'll get the skimed milk. I wouldn't care if I didn't get anything from the

Association as I have been

well supplied with "goodies" but some of the fellow don't get very much so if you send me what you would give to the Association I could give it to Them and you would be sure that it was doing (a soldier) some good. Hope you are feeling well and happy, don't worry as I am feeling fine. Still putting on weight; I sent a present to Flora (?) and with it I sent Ralph and Howard a present. Nearly time to eat so I guess I'll have to say good-bye. Hope to see you soon so cheer-up "clouds will be sunshine to-morrow." Good-bye Charles E Crockett Co. A 102 M.G. Bn' Am. Expid P.S. Went to church yesterday but the v.m.c.a. Section is a dead one. Haven't started

smoking yet.




Around July 17, 1918, Charles was wounded at the 2nd Battle of Marne, also known as the Battle of Reims.







SALEM.-Charles E. Crockett, of 10 Roslyn St., Salem, associated with A. C. Lawrence Leather Co., and Seal Tanning Co., of Boston for many years, died at Veterans Administration Hospital, Jamaica Plain, Wednesday.

A native of Lynn, he had captained Lynn English High School football team in 1914. He had attended Huntington Preparatory School in Boston and had served overseas with the 102d Machine Gun Battalion, AEF. He was wounded in the Marne offensive.

He was a member of Salem American Legion Post, 216 Associates of Boston, Golden Flecce Lodge, A.F. & A.M., of Lynn, and Farragut Rowing Club.

He leaves his wife, Mrs. Alyce (Guy) Crockett, a daughter, Mrs. Elizabeth Loubris of Beverly, a brother, Harold T. Crockett of Lynn and four grandchildren.

Funeral services will be at Levesque Funeral Chapel, 15 Harbor St., Salem, Saturday morning at 10 o'clock.
